



TRENNY STOVALL, JD Principal and Co-Owner

Trenny Stovall has dedicated her career to helping professionals build the capacity to level the playing field for disadvantaged populations and communities. In 2019, Trenny retired after 17 years as founding director of the DeKalb County Child Advocacy Center, Georgia's first legal advocacy center dedicated to the representation of abused and neglected children. Stovall structured and led the organization

through the settlement of the federal class-action lawsuit <u>Kenny A</u>, which established national best practice standards for representing children in dependency cases. Stovall oversaw the representation of more than 15,000 children and youth. Through cross-sector collaboration, thousands of children achieved permanency and many accessed resources and support that helped them to bridge the opportunity gap. In 2016-17, Trenny served as Interim Chief of Staff to DeKalb County's Chief Operating Officer, where she was responsible for strategic coordination across operational clusters for Georgia's third most populous county. Stovall has also served on numerous state and national committees to advance the interests of children, youth, families, and communities in need.

Trenny is also committed to international leadership development and advocacy. She developed and facilitates the Women's Empowerment and Leadership programming for the Washington-Mandela Young African Leaders Initiative (GSU cohort) - a competitive and prestigious international leadership development program sponsored by the U.S. State Department. Stovall also served as planning committee member and facilitator for the International Conferences on the Legal Rights of Street Children in London, England, and Sao Paulo, Brazil where leaders convened from around the world to develop draft comments for the UN Committee on the Child regarding the need for globally-recognized legal standards for the treatment of street-connected children.

Trenny is principal and co-owner of LGC CORE Consulting leading the firm's organizational health and capacity building workstreams.
